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Traveling to Whittier, Alaska

The Inn at Whittier is located about an hour south of Anchorage in the small town of Whittier, Alaska. Follow the Seward Highway south out of Anchorage along the Turnagain Arm. Turn left at Portage (about mile 40), then travel several miles to Portage Lake, the start of the Whittier tunnel.



The Anton Anderson Memorial Tunnel is the longest highway tunnel in North America. The tunnel is open from 7:00am-10:30pm during the winter, and from 5:30am-11:00pm during the summer. The tunnel is only one lane wide and more than two miles long, so traffic is allowed through on an hourly schedule. Inbound traffic is released on the half-hour. The Inn is highlighted by its lighthouse tower design. The entrance to our lobby is accented by a grand fireplace which makes this an ideal area to relax or just read a book. The predominant windows along the water side of The Inn afford guests spectacular views of the Sound and surrounding mountains, as well as a peek at the catch-of-the-day being delivered to the Inn's dock.
